

**JANUARY 2023 SURVEY OF U.S. PARENTS
 TOPLINES – SELECTED SURVEY QUESTIONS**

Two surveys were delivered to Survey Monkey’s National Audience panel between January 3-6, 2023. This panel consists of millions of respondents who opt in to receive and complete online surveys. Survey respondents included 3,820 parents of school-aged children (defined as children between ages 5 and 18 years old) across two surveys. To prevent biasing of responses, the survey did not reference the National School Choice Awareness Foundation or National School Choice Week. Totals have been weighted using the Census Bureau’s American Community Survey to reflect the demographic composition of the United States. The modeled error estimate for this survey is plus or minus 2.8 percentage points.
