## Proclamation by Governor Patrick Morrisey

Whereas, all children in West Virginia should have access to the highest-quality education possible; and

Whereas, West Virginia recognizes the important role that an effective education plays in preparing all students in West Virginia to be successful adults; and

Whereas, quality education is critically important to the economic vitality of West Virginia; and

Whereas, West Virginia is home to a multitude of high-quality public and nonpublic schools from which parents can choose for their children, in addition to families who educate their children in the home; and

Whereas, educational variety not only helps to diversify our economy but also enhances the vibrancy of our community; and

Whereas, West Virginia has many high-quality teaching professionals in all types of school settings who are committed to educating our children; and

Whereas, during the 2023-2024 school year, the Hope Scholarship Program made 5,443 awards to students in nearly every county; and

Whereas, during the 2023-2024 school year, a total of 2,270 students are enrolled in public charter schools; and

Whereas, on January 14, 2025, Executive Order 2-25 was issued to help ensure that West Virginia had the broadest and most effective school choice program in the nation; and

Whereas, School Choice Week is celebrated across the country by millions of students, parents, educators, schools, and organizations to raise awareness of the need for effective educational options.

Now, Therefore, Be it Resolved that I, Patrick Morrisey, Governor of the Great State of West Virginia, do hereby proclaim *January 26 - February 1, 2025* as:

in the Mountain State and encourage all citizens to join me in observance.
